

Another Arab sector high school Bagrut exam leaked and was canceled

This is not the first time a matriculation exam sheet leaks and is passed around students in the Arab sector. The Education Ministry has decided to cancel the exam following the incident.

A matriculation exam in an Arab school was cancelled after the document had leaked and was passed around on the social media. The exam was scheduled to take place at 1 pm on Thursday; however, the students will now have to wait for the Education Ministry to reschedule it.

The [Education Ministry](#) decided to cancel both parts of the exam after it was discovered the exam sheet had leaked and reached many students. "This is not the first time this has happened. The sheet leaked and after we walked in the classroom we were told the exam had been canceled," a student from Shefa-'Amr told Channel 2 News. According to the student, this phenomenon occurs mostly in schools in the Arab sector. "Someone is trying to harm the Arab students."

[Several exams have been cancelled](#) over the past few months in the Arab sector after the exam sheets had leaked and were passed around by students on the social media. Today, Education Ministry officials stated, "The phenomenon is dangerous, especially in light of the series of leaks we were witness to in the winter exams."

Education Ministry CEO Michal Cohen has instructed the Ministry's examination department to address the police's investigations department and request that they open an investigation and bring to justice those responsible for leaking the exam.
